Staffing

A Special Education teacher has decided to stay home with her children, so we will have an opening in Special Education.

We will also have a health and PE job opening, as Bridget Cobb will be taking a job outside of the educational setting.

FFO got approval for a Fall Fling / Glow Run that still incorporates clubs / activities, who can
