<u>Counseling Website</u>: If you haven't visited our website, please take a moment to do so! We have a wealth of information about a variety of topics, including <u>Mental Health and Wellness resources</u>.

NAMI Presentations: During the months of November - January, all CFHS students will spend one Social Studies class with presenters of NAMI Southern Arizona (National Alliance on Mental Illness), learning about Mental Illness through their Ending the Silence program.

<u>Virtual Calm Room:</u> This virtual calming room has soothing music, app suggestions, community resources, mindfulness strategies, and calming activities to help with overall well-being. Check it out!

<u>AP Test Registration:</u> Registration deadline extended to **NOVEMBER 10!** Information regarding AP exam registration has been shared with students in all AP classrooms. Click <u>here</u> for necessary information! All intended exams must be ordered NO LATER THAN November 10 (with the exception of semester 2 Government or Macroeconomics which has an order deadline of March 1).

FAFSA / Financial Aid: The FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) opened for the class of 2022 on Oct 1. Every senior should submit the FAFSA during October/November so that financial aid awards can be calculated, offered, and considered. Completing the FAFSA is the only way to access federal aid (including non-need based federal loans), and some state aid and merit aid programs (scholarships) also require completion of the FAFSA. Go to <u>fafsa.ed.gov</u> for information and instructions. Find more info here: <u>bit.ly/SeniorFlash</u>. Find information regarding scholarship searches here: bit.ly/SchHlts.

College Applications: Over 200 seniors have already applied and been accepted to UA, NAU, and/or ASU. Our state universities practice 'rolling admissions' ~ i.e., decisions are given approximately 2-3 weeks after the student's application is received. Students are encouraged to complete an in-state application by mid to late October. We will hold an application workshop for Pima Community College in February. The first round of college out-of-state applications are due generally November 1 or 15. Students are encouraged to apply by the fall deadline so that they may know their admissions status prior to winter break. Those who wait until the January deadline will not know their admissions status until April.

Senior Lab: Counselors are available in Room 115 (House One) every Monday, 2:20-4:15 for questions and drop in assistance. Please stop in to let your counselor know your plans and for help with applications, MaiaLearning, etc.

MaiaLearning: Seniors are reminded that they must enter all the colleges to which they are applying to their "Applying List" under the Universities tab in their MaiaLearning account. You must also enter how you are applying and click on "Request Transcript" for each school. If any college requires letters of recommendation, please follow the instructions in the College Application FAQ document: bit.ly/CAppFAQ. Students are to ask teachers/counselors for any needed recommendation letters at least 3-4 weeks in advance of the first deadline. Drop in at the Senior Lab or make an appointment to see your counselor asap if you need assistance.

COVID -19: For all phases of the recovery, the public/students should continue good prevention practices. Please see Pima County website for additional info at https://webcms.pima.gov/government/health_department/

Illness/Flu Season:

Please remember to keep students' home if they have a fever over 100 degrees, are coughing persistently, are vomiting, or have diarrhea. It is better for students to stay home one day and get better, than come to school and prolong the illness. Encourage frequent had washing, use of hand sanitizer and consider getting a flu shot for your family. For further information and where to get your free Flu shot, please visit Pima County website at http://www.webcms.pima.gov/health/education_and_outreach/flu

Please be aware of the following highly contagious illnesses:

Influenza Flu: Exclude from school until fever free without Acetaminophen/lbuprofen. The Center for Disease Control (CDC) recommends getting the flu shot every year before flu season starts. Influenza virus has a rapid Onset and is usually accompanied by a fever, body aches and respiratory symptoms, for more information, see http://www.webmed.com/cold-and-flu/flu-guide/is-it-cold-flu

Streptococcal Bacterial Infection (Strep Throat): Exclude until 24 hours after antibiotic use and fever-free without Acetaminophen/Ibuprofen. Symptoms may include: severe sore throat, fever, body aches, rash. See healthcare provider. If untreated, there is a potential heart risk.

Conjunctivitis (**Pink-Eye**): See a health care provider and keep your son/daughter home for 24 hours of treatment before returning to school.

Infectious Mononucleosis Viral Infection (Mono): Exclude from school until fever-free without Acetaminophen/Ibuprofen. Symptoms can include fatigue and weakness, sore throat, fatigue, listlessness, fever, skin rash on the neck or shoulders, jaundice, loss of appetite. Symptoms may last 2-3 week or up to 2-3 months before one feels better. Avoid close contact such as kissing, hugging, or sharing utensils, cups or food with an infected person, as it is spread through saliva. Encourage frequent hand washing, especially after touching the face and mouth area. Treat fever and discomfort with medication recommended by the Health Care Provider. Much rest is needed. Re: CFSD Open Enrollment Program for the 2022-2023 School Year

The Catalina Foothills School District (CFSD) will begin its open enrollment application procedures for the 2022-2023 school year on **November 1, 2021**.

Pursuant to A.R.S. §15-816 and A.R.S. §15-816.01 all Arizona school districts follow a prescribed procedure and timetable for admitting out-of-district transfer students and resident transfer students (those who live in the District but are attending a school outside the attendance area of their residence). All students who currently attend CFSD schools and reside in other districts, and all CFSD resident students who attend a school outside of the attendance area of their residence, are impacted by this law.

We require *all open enrollment students to apply for admission each year*. Therefore, if your child is a resident transfer (open enrollment) student and you want him/her to continue in that capacity, or if your child resides outside of the district, either as a continuing or a new open enrollment student, please complete an open enrollment application online **between November 1, 2021 and January 31, 2022**.

Open enrollment applications and information regarding the application process are on the district Web site, www.cfsd16.org (as of November 1, 2021). Under Parents, select Open Enrollment.

Electronic applications must be submitted **no later than January 31, 2022**. Decisions about admission, based on capacity, will be made by March 1, 2022. At that time, all applicants who applied during the application period will be notified by email whether their applications were accepted, waitlisted, or declined. *Note: A separate application must be completed for each student*.

Please keep in mind that annually, the open enrollment process involves three steps: application, notification of our decision and, if accepted, online registration.


