State & District Testing at CFHS in 2022-2023

The Catalina Foothills School District (CFSD) is Tucson's leading educational choice for PreK-12. Academic achievement is a high priority as evidenced by test scores that exceed state and national averages. The district uses a variety of assessments to measure student achievement and inform instruction. Statewide achievement tests, required by federal and state law, are part of a larger local and state assessment system.

When: Late February as determined by the US History teacher.

Note: Passing the AZ Civics Test is a graduation requirement. Students may retake as necessary.

AP Exams

Who: Primarily open to any students currently enrolled in an AP Course at CFHS.

CFHS Course Selection and 2022-23 Registration

March 6 - Podcast during Advisory, students receive Course Request Form and instructions.

March 6-10 - Counselors in the cafeteria during both lunches to answer questions. Students obtain needed signatures from teachers and parents/guardians. Students who have completed the process are welcome to turn in their forms during this time.

March 10 at 11:59pm - Deadline to enter classes online using StudentVUE.

March 13-17 - Students meet with Counselors during Math class to turn in completed forms.

Reminder: Families must complete district registration every year. If you live in CFSD, please log into your Parent VUE account and choose "Online Registration" in the upper right-hand corner. If you attend CFHS through Open Enrollment, you must first complete the annual Open Enrollment application. Go to www.cfsd16.org and complete "Apply for Open Enrollment" as soon as possible.

Senior College Info

Next Steps: Once you've made a decision about what school to attend...

- Notify any other schools that you are withdrawing from their pool so they can remove you from their mailings and open your space for another applicant.
- Update your MaiaLearning account by completing the "Application Status" section at the bottom of each of the "Colleges Applying" boxes. You'll be asked in April to complete a "Green Sheet" indicating your final decision and where to send your final transcript.
- Follow your school's instructions for registering for Orientation, completing placement testing, making a
 deposit for student housing, etc.

FAFSA / Financial Aid / Scholarships:

- If you haven't yet completed the FAFSA to determine need-based aid eligibility and/or to access the opportunity to apply for low/deferred interest federal loans (regardless of need), then you are encouraged to do this asap. UA requests all incoming students complete their FAFSA by April 1. For tips and resources, review our FAFSA document. If you have specific questions about the application or if you would like to request a review of your award (perhaps they can assist with finding more money), go to the Financial Aid and Scholarships page of the college's website for information on how to review your award.
- Scholarships ~ The biggest source of scholarship money is from the university you attend (find their Financial Aid and Scholarships page), but there are additional scholarship sources as well. Check out our Scholarship Highlights doc for info and resources.

GUIDELINES: Open to all AZ students, grades 1-12. There is no entry fee. Poems can be on any topic; if they are not written in English, please provide a translation.

Submission by email is preferred, but U.S. Mail submissions are accepted.

If emailing: attach a copy of the poem to the email. DO NOT put your name and address on the poem. In the body of the email, enter the Title of the poem along with name, address and age.

If mailing: Enclose one copy of the poem, and a second copy with your name, address and age.

Please proofread all work carefully.

Each entrant must make a declaration of originality. Include the following statement in your submission email or on the second copy of your poem with you name/address/age:

Format: All submissions should be typed in Times New Roman 12-point font or hand printed very clearly on plain, white $8 \frac{1}{2} \times 11$ white paper with no illustrations.

Poet's information should also be clearly typed or printed in English, no illustrations.

Submissions have a maximum of 42 lines per poem and a limit of 50 characters per line. Spaces or breaks between stanzas will count as a line, but the poem title does not count as a line.

Deadline: Mailed entries must be postmarked by April 30, 2023, or emailed by midnight, April 30, 2023.

Prize Awards: Cash prizes will be awarded to First, Second and Third Place Winning Poems according to age/grade bracket.
