### **IV.** Update on Hybrid Learning

Jody Brase, Jen Brock

- Jen: Currently have 823 students in-person (IP) and 945 remote (R). Last week we adjusted class caps to allow majority of in-person students in classrooms while maintaining distancing. Graduation - still planning on regular graduation ceremony, two guests per senior.
- Jody: We still have an application process for remote learners so that we can ensure scheduling/classroom logistics work. Thanked teachers profusely for continuing their hard work and engaging/managing both remote and in-person students.
- Kelly: Even for IP students, not normal class experience. We cannot get the groupwork/collaboration in place, which helps with learning/engagement, due to distancing. Now with more desks/students in rooms, does help with discussions.
- Gary: Has enjoyed having kids back and developing that sense of community in a classroom. Adjustment for IP students to come back on campus and not be in their rooms all day. Nice to see "kids being kids"
- Jessie/Robin: Counseling dept working on video/messaging for tips for students for returning to campus and how to "be a HS student." Interviewing students who have recently returned regarding their experience and their advice for others.
- Jay: How are teachers feeling about technology?
- Gary: Frustration with camera and amount of computers needed. Nearpod was good way to check in with students when majority were remote. Now with more IP, better just to use chat feature. Formative would be better with plagiarism check. Google Classroom has been awesome and effective. Again, wishes there was an unlimited plagiarism check. Having students with their own computers has been nice, but will be nice to be able to go back to "pen and paper" for some

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- assignments (i.e. taking notes and writing things in their own words) to help with accountability.
- Kelly: Math dept loves the cameras. Students constantly thanking teachers for that sense of normalcy in allowing cameras to capture board (notes, examples, etc).
   Feels like camera helped maintain functioning math classrooms. Teachers have mixed feelings about Formative/Nearpod, etc. Many teachers are integrating pencil/paper tasks for IP students. Goal is for students IP are not using computers when in class.
- Justin: Sees both sides of usefulness of camera. When he was able to use it in math class, did find it useful. Has used Formative daily for "quick feedback tool" as replacement for whiteboards for R learners - chat feature seemed too limiting.
- Kelly: Blessing of CFSD is that teachers have the technology access/options.
   Students
- Justin: State Testing Numbers as of 4/15:
  - AzM2 testing attendance Data (make-ups in process)
    - Tuesday, April 6:
      - 89.8% of 10th grade students tested (397/442)
      - 97.6% of in-person students tested (204/209)
      - 82.8% of remote students tested (193/233)
    - Thursday, April 8:
      - 88.5% of 10th grade students tested (391/442)
      - 97.6% of in-person students tested (204/209)
      - 80.3% of remote students tested (187/233)
    - Tuesday, April 13th:
      - 87.9% of 10th grade students tested (387/440)
      - 97.6% of in-person students tested (207/212)
      - *78.9% of remote students tested (180/228)*
  - AzM2 data of students who completed all 5 tests (we are still doing makeups)
    - 85.4% of 10th grade students took all 5 tests (376/440)
    - 95.8% of in-person students took all 5 tests (203/212)
    - 75.9% of remote students took all 5 tests (173/228)
  - AzSci Testing data: (no make-ups yet)
    - 91.9% 11th grade students tested (386/420)
    - *94.9% of in-person students tested (187/197)*
    - 89.2% of remote students tested (199/223)
- Jay: applauded numbers, especially for remote students, based on his experience.
- AP Exams (Jessie): 1,030 AP exam registrations (up from previous years). Exams run May 3-17. Will be in person, no open notes this year.
- EOY Updates (Jen/Jody):
  - Graduation depending on numbers/data, may be able to increase to 4 guests per student. Will keep us updated.

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- o Parade will send survey to seniors re attendance/interest
- Another senior meeting May 7

  - Grade 9-11 academic letters will be sent; no ceremony this year
- Next week speaker/performer auditions
