State & District Testing at CFHS in 2022-2023

The Catalina Foothills School District (CFSD) is Tucson's leading educational choice for PreK-12. Academic achievement is a high priority as evidenced by test scores that exceed state and national averages. The Arizona Department of Education (ADE) recognized CFSD as one of the top performing school districts in the state of Arizona, and Niche recognized CFSD with the highest ranking for a unified school district in Arizona from 2015-2022.

The district uses a variety of assessments to measure student achievement and inform instruction. Statewide achievement tests, required by federal and state law, are part of a larger local and state assessment system.

AzSCI (State Achievement Test)

Who: Required for all 11th grade students **When:** Wednesday, April 5, 2023 (Updated)

ACT Aspire (State Achievement Test)

Who: All 9th grade students **When:** Tuesday, April 18, 2023

AZ Civics Test

Who: All students taking US History

When: Late February as determined by the US History teacher.

Note: Passing the AZ Civics Test is a graduation requirement. Students may retake as necessary.

AP Exams

Who: Primarily open to any students currently enrolled in an AP Course at CFHS.

When: May 1, 2023 through May 12, 2022. Specific dates found on the College Board website.

Senior College Info

Next Steps: Once you've made a decision about what school to attend...

- Notify any other schools that you are withdrawing from their pool so they can remove you from their mailings and open your space for another applicant.
- Update your MaiaLearning account by completing the "Application Status" section at the bottom of each of the "Colleges Applying" boxes. You'll be asked in April to complete a "Green Sheet" indicating your final decision and where to send your final transcript.
- Follow your school's instructions for registering for Orientation, completing placement testing, making a deposit for student housing, etc.

FAFSA / Financial Aid / Scholarships:

- If you haven't yet completed the **FAFSA** to determine need-based aid eligibility and/or to access the opportunity to apply for low/deferred interest federal loans (regardless of need), then you are encouraged to do this asap. UA requests all incoming students complete their FAFSA by April 1. For tips and resources, review our <u>FAFSA document</u>. If you have specific questions about the application or if you would like to request a review of your award (perhaps they can assist with finding more money), go to the Financial Aid and Scholarships page of the college's website for information on how to review your award.
- **Scholarships** ~ The biggest source of scholarship money is from the university you attend (find their Financial Aid and Scholarships page), but there are additional scholarship sources as well. Check out our <u>Scholarship Highlights</u> doc for info and resources.

Credit Recovery ~ Registration opens April 17!

Students who failed a core class or earned a D (retaking is optional in this case) are invited to retake courses at CFHS through our Summer Course Emporium program. Summer Course Emporium will run from May 31 to June 30 and is a supervised computer lab where students log on to the CFHS-approved Edgenuity platform to repeat the course content. Upon completion of the coursework, the repeated course will go on the transcript with the earned replacement grade and the previously earned F will turn to an RF (repeated/replaced) and come out of the GPA calculation. Further details and the link to register will be available in an upcoming Falcon Flash. **This year Summer Course Emporium will be free.**

TESTING FOR GIFTED IDENTIFICATION

The Catalina Foothills School District (CFSD) offers high school students the opportunity to take the *Cognitive Abilities Test (CogAT)* in order to assess their verbal, quantitative, and non-verbal reasoning abilities. In accordance with ARS 15-770, initial identification for gifted services is determined by a score at or above the 97th percentile in verbal, quantitative, or nonverbal reasoning abilities on a state-approved test. Identification is the process of verifying students who have "superior intellect or advanced learning ability." CFSD uses the [state-approved] CogAT as one measure to determine if placement for gifted services is appropriate.

The high school offers Honors, Honors credit, Advanced Placement (college level courses), and classroom differentiation for gifted learners. Taking the test does not limit the choices students have to enroll in Honors or AP classes. Students may generally self-select courses. A list of course descriptions and prerequisites is available through the school. Test results provide school personnel with information about students' learned reasoning abilities in the three areas most linked to academic success in school.

Testing is being offered for CFSD high school students on the following dates: **April 25-26, 2023**.

The test will be administered at <u>Esperero Canyon Middle School</u> and will begin at <u>4:15pm</u> each day of the two-day testing period. Students must attend both testing days and parents must provide transportation to and from the testing location.

Students who have participated in gifted programs in other districts may submit testing information to the school if the tests from the former district are state-approved tests and were administered within the last two years.

Parents who want their students to be tested must fill out and return the "Permission Form: Testing for Gifted Services" prior to the testing date. Please contact the main office at the high school for the form.

Submission by email is preferred, but U.S. Mail submissions are accepted.

If emailing: attach a copy of the poem to the email. DO NOT put your name and address on the poem. In the body of the email, enter the Title of the poem along with name, address and age.

If mailing: Enclose one copy of the poem, and a second copy with your name, address and age.

Please proofread all work carefully.

Each entrant must make a declaration of originality. Include the following statement in your submission email or on the second copy of your poem with you name/address/age:

Format: All submissions should be typed in Times New Roman 12-point font or hand printed very clearly on plain, white $8 \frac{1}{2} \times 11$ white paper with no illustrations.

Poet's information should also be clearly typed or printed in English, no illustrations.

Submissions have a maximum of 42 lines per poem and a limit of 50 characters per line. Spaces or breaks between stanzas will count as a line, but the poem title does not count as a line.

Deadline: Mailed entries must be postmarked by April 30, 2023, or emailed by midnight, April 30, 2023.
