Re: CFSD Open Enrollment Program for the 2022-2023 School Year

The Catalina Foothills School District (CFSD) will begin its open enrollment application procedures for the 2022-2023 school year on **November 1, 2021**.

Pursuant to A.R.S. §15-816 and A.R.S. §15-816.01 all Arizona school districts follow a prescribed procedure and timetable for admitting out-of-district transfer students and resident transfer students (those who live in the District but are attending a school outside the attendance area of their residence). All students who currently attend CFSD schools and reside in other districts, and all CFSD resident students who attend a school outside of the attendance area of their residence, are impacted by this law.

We require *all open enrollment students to apply for admission each year*. Therefore, if your child is a resident transfer (open enrollment) student and you want him/her to continue in that capacity, or if your child resides outside of the district, either as a continuing or a new open enrollment student, please complete an open enrollment application online **between November 1, 2021 and January 31, 2022**.

Open enrollment applications and information regarding the application process are on the district Web site, www.cfsd16.org (as of November 1, 2021). Under Parents, select Open Enrollment.

Electronic applications must be submitted **no later than January 31, 2022**. Decisions about admission, based on capacity, will be made by March 1, 2022. At that time, all applicants who applied during the application period will be notified by email whether their applications were accepted, waitlisted, or declined. *Note: A separate application must be completed for each student.*

Please keep in mind that annually, the open enrollment process involves three steps: application, notification of our decision and, if accepted, online registration.

Tips for Families: As the holidays approach we want to offer some ideas and suggestions to manage stress and have fun as a family. The following has been taken and/or adapted from the [Pima County Health Department](#) and the [Pima County Superintendent's Office](#):

Ideas for What Parents Can Do:

- Learn & model stress management skills.
- Listen & acknowledge frustration and disappointment; check in if you observe concerning behavior.
- Avoid responding to anger or irritability with a punitive approach
- Avoid trying to immediately fix problems. Allowing your child to vent and express themselves is most helpful in many situations.
- Give children a sense of control.
- Help your child set up and maintain a routine.
- Brainstorm projects/activities your child enjoys and spend time together as a family.
- Give children input on meals or chores; let them have buy-in on daily tasks.

Ideas for What Youth Can Do:

- Exercise, eat regularly, develop a healthy sleep schedule, and spend time outdoors.
- Avoid alcohol, illegal drugs, tobacco, excess caffeine, and excess screen time.
- Learn relaxation exercises (i.e. abdominal breathing, muscle relaxation).
- Express emotions in polite and assertive ways: "I feel angry when you yell at me."
- Learn practical coping skills. For example, build a network of friends who support you in a positive way.
- Decrease negative self-talk and challenge negative thoughts with alternative, neutral, or positive thoughts: "my life will never get better" can be transformed into "I may feel helpless now, but things will probably get better if I keep working hard and ask for help."
- Learn to feel good about doing a competent/"good enough" job rather than demanding perfection from yourself and others.
- Learn what you can control in your environment and try not to fixate on things outside of your control.
- Take a break from stressful situations and try stress-reducing activities like listening to music, talking to a friend, drawing/writing, or spending time with a pet.
- Set a reasonable goal for yourself or learn a new skills/hobby.

Senior Lab: Counselors are available in Room 115 (House One) every Monday of fall semester, 2:20-4:15 for questions and drop in assistance. Please stop in for assistance before finals week.

First You Hafta FAFSA! The FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) opened for the class of 2022 on Oct 1. Every senior should submit the FAFSA so financial aid awards can be calculated, offered, and considered. Completing the FAFSA is the only way to access federal aid (including non-need based federal loans), and some state aid and merit aid programs (scholarships) also require completion of the FAFSA. Go to [FAFSA.ed.gov](https://fafsa.ed.gov) to get started.

NAMI Presentations: During the months of November - January, all CFHS students will spend one Social Studies class with presenters of NAMI Southern Arizona (National Alliance on Mental Illness), learning about Mental Illness through their Ending the Silence program. Health Office Updates

What's New for the 2021-22 Flu (Influenza Virus) Season?

- It's not too late to get the flu shot!
- Flu vaccines have been updated to better match circulating viruses.
- There will be some new vaccines on the market this season.
- The recommendations for people with egg allergies have changed.

The flu shot is recommended for anyone over 6 months, for anyone at high risk: chronic health conditions: asthma, diabetes, heart and/or lung disease, people 65 years and older.

Flu-like symptoms may include:

- **fever, cough, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, body aches, headache, chills, fatigue, sometimes vomiting and diarrhea.**
- **Covid-19 is still here. Please wear your masks and practice safe distancing.**

Preventative and coping measures:

- 1) Try to avoid close contact with sick people
- 2) When sick, stay home and avoid contact with others to not spread germs.
- 3) If sick with flu-like symptoms, stay home for at least 24 hours after your fever is gone, except to get medical care.
- 4) Wash your hands often with soap and water. Use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer if no water available.
- 5) Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth, as germs spread quickly this way.
- 6) Clean/disinfect surfaces and objects that may be contaminated with germs, flu virus.
- 7) Do not share drinks, utensils, musical instruments, food when sick.
- 8) See your doctor if you have a high fever (over 100) and/or cough that lasts more than 5 days.
- 9) Be sure to get a doctor's note to cover the school absences.

Additional Safety/Health Concerns:

- 1) Not eating or drinking can cause headaches, stomach aches, fatigue that will not be treated by a pain killer. Bring or buy food/water to avoid these distractions from your school work.
- 2) The Health Office (Nurse's Office) does not have allergy medications.
- 3) If you suffer an injury on campus, be sure to report it to your teacher immediately and then see the school nurse.
- 4) Remember to dress accordingly with the cooler weather and to abide by the dress code.
- 5) Don't text and drive.

Fentanyl Warning for Parents/Guardians and Students

November 22, 2021

Overdose deaths in Pima County are on the rise. Last year fentanyl was the number one drug contributing to overdose deaths in Pima County. This year the trend has worsened. Fentanyl is now the top cause of death for people under 20 in Pima County.

WHAT IS FENTANYL AND WHY IS IT DANGEROUS?

Fentanyl is a synthetic opioid 50 to 100 times more potent than heroin or morphine. In the medical field it is used to treat severe pain, but it is also produced and sold illegally. Illicit fentanyl is often found in counterfeit pills that can look like legitimate pharmaceutical pills. Unsuspecting users — especially young people — may be unaware of the possibility that legitimate-looking pills may not be what they seem, and could be deadly.



WHAT CAN WE DO TO KEEP KIDS SAFE?

- Recognize the signs and symptoms of drug use
 - Irritability, disrupted sleep, poor eating habits, decreased school performance, avoiding time with family, and withdrawing from normal activities and/or interests.
- Recognize what illicit fentanyl looks like
 - Fentanyl has been found in counterfeit oxycodone pills marked as "M30," counterfeit Percocet, and counterfeit Xanax. It has also been found in pills marked "K9," "A215," and "V48." These pills are typically blue, green, or white in color, though counterfeit pills may occur in any color or shape. Fentanyl has also been found in powders.
- Teach about the dangers of fentanyl
 - Kids and adolescents may not be aware that a single pill can be deadly. Young people should be educated about what fentanyl is, why it is dangerous, and where it might be encountered. Counterfeit pills are especially dangerous because they purport to be something they are not. Never take a pill unless it was prescribed to you and obtained from a pharmacy.

- **Secure and/or dispose of prescription medications**
 - Secure all prescription medications in a lock box in your home.
 - If a child is prescribed an opioid by a pediatrician, supervise daily until the medication is finished, use a pill box to keep track, and never let your child manage on their own.
 - Dispose of unused or expired medications. Find a disposal location near you at www.pima.gov/disposeamed.

- **Recognize overdoses and intervene before they become fatal**
 - Signs of an overdose can include slow or no breathing; snoring or gurgling; paleness; cool skin; blue lips; and extreme drowsiness.
 - If you suspect an overdose, call 911 immediately and stay with the person. Arizona's Good Samaritan law will protect you and the person who is overdosing from drug possession charges.
 - Give naloxone (Narcan®). Multiple doses of naloxone may be necessary to counteract the potency of fentanyl. Naloxone works in the body for 30 to 90 minutes. It is possible for overdose symptoms to return after naloxone wears off.
 - Find out where you can get naloxone at PimaHelpline.org/Naloxone.
 - Lastly, many fatal overdoses occur during the night. If you suspect an overdose, NEVER leave a person alone or allow them to "sleep it off"

HOW IS THE HEALTH DEPARTMENT RESPONDING TO THE FENTANYL CRISIS?

- The Pima County Health Department has issued a number of public health alerts in response to the rise in overdose deaths, [particularly fentanyl-involved deaths](#).

- On June 9, 2021, a Drug Overdose Death Public Health Emergency was issued in Pima County. PCHD launched a fentanyl awareness campaign based on the DEA's One Pill Can Kill campaign to bring attention to the presence of fentanyl in our community.

- We urge all parents/guardians to stock naloxone or Narcan®, a medication that counteracts the life-threatening effects of an opioid overdose, in their home first aid kits. Narcan® is now available in limited supply at Pima County libraries and can be purchased at any pharmacy.

- We also offer the following trainings to the community at no cost:
 - Narcan®: How to recognize an opioid overdose and administer Narcan®
 - Rx360: Understanding prescription drug misuse and abuse
 - Strengthening Families Program: An evidence-based family skills training program found to improve family relationships, school performance, and reduce substance misuse in children.

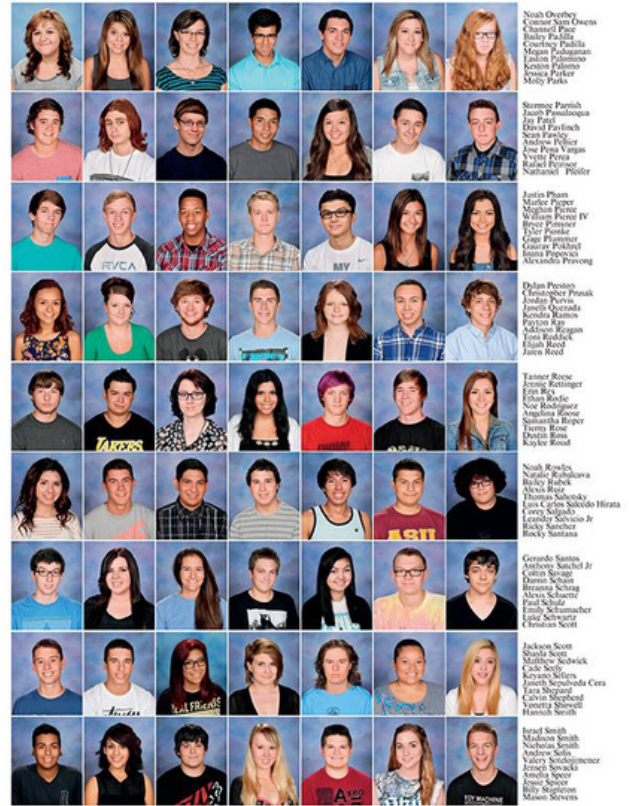
PORTRAIT PHOTOS

Q. What should I write in the tribute?

- This is completely up to you. Many tributes include a “Congratulations” or “Good Luck” message. Others include a short story or something meaningful between the family and the senior.
- Include the names of the family members sending the message.
- Check your spelling and grammar, we are not responsible for these errors since you are typing up your own message.
- Word count limits do exist!
 - ¼ page – 50 words max
 - ½ page – 100 words max
 - Full page- 50-100 words depending on how many photos are used

CFHS administration and Yearbook staff reserve the right to remove or edit any inappropriate wording or photographs as well as any damaging or derogatory comments written in this section.

Q. Do I have to complete my work in one sitting?

- No. You can begin working on your template, save your work, and come back to it at another time.

- Nothing is final until you hit the submit button and pay for the tribute. Just don't forget you started it and then miss the deadline!

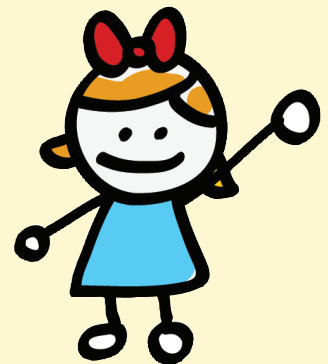
