To: Parents of CFSD Students From: Mary Kamerzell, Superintendent Re: CFSD Open Enrollment Program for the 2022-2023 School Year

The Catalina Foothills School District (CFSD) will begin its open enrollment application procedures for the 2022-2023 school year on **November 1, 2021**.

Pursuant to A.R.S. §15-816 and A.R.S. §15-816.01 all Arizona school districts follow a prescribed procedure and timetable for admitting out-of-district transfer students and resident transfer students (those who live in the District but are attending a school outside the attendance area of their residence). All students who currently attend CFSD schools and reside in other districts, and all CFSD resident students who attend a school outside of the attendance area of their residence, are impacted by this law.

We require *all open enrollment students to apply for admission each year*. Therefore, if your child is a resident transfer (open enrollment) student and you want him/her to continue in that capacity, or if your child resides outside of the district, either as a continuing or a new open enrollment student, please complete an open enrollment application online **between November 1, 2021 and January 31, 2022**.

Open enrollment applications and information regarding the application process are on the district Web site, <u>www.cfsd16.org</u> (as of November 1, 2021). Under Parents, select Open Enrollment.

Electronic applications must be submitted **no later than January 31, 2022**. Decisions about admission, based on capacity, will be made by March 1, 2022. At that time, all applicants who applied during the application period will be notified by email whether their applications were accepted, waitlisted, or declined. *Note: A separate application must be completed for each student*.

Please keep in mind that annually, the open enrollment process involves three steps: application, notification of our decision and, if accepted, online registration.

Happy New Year CFHS Families!

We look forward to working with you during this 2nd semester. As seniors enter their final semester of high school, we will be preparing our 9-11 graders (through ECAP lessons in their English classes) to choose their classes for the 2022/23 school year in January and early February. Course Selection will officially begin the last week in February. We will be providing more information to families as this time approaches.

Credit Recovery

10-12 th grade students who failed a core class and need to do credit recovery should contact their counselor as soon as possible about adding Course Emporium to their spring schedule or formulating an alternate plan to retake the required course. Course Emporium is a supervised computer lab where students log on to the CFHS-approved Edgenuity platform to repeat the course content. Upon completion of the coursework, the repeated course will go on the transcript with the earned replacement grade and the previously earned F will turn to an RF (repeated/replaced) and come out of the GPA calculation. Course Emporium is entered as a period in the student's schedule (in lieu of a free period, Study Hall, or elective). Course Emporium is also offered over the summer for credit recovery at no cost from May 31-July 1. 9th graders who failed a core class 1st semester should plan to take summer school Course Emporium.

ASVAB Test

The Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) is a heavily researched and well-respected aptitude test developed by the Department of Defense. It measures a young adult's strengths and potential for success in military training and life careers. CFHS will be offering this test free of charge to interested 11th and 12th grade students on March 31st. Please look forward to future announcements or contact Dr. Bryan for more information.
