TYPE OF SCHOOL:

A comprehensive four-year public high school located in the foothills of the Catalina Mountains, on the northern edge of Tucson, Arizona, USA.

HISTORY: *Established 1992. Graduated first class in 1996.*

ACCREDITATION: *North Central Commission of Accreditation (NCA), part of the AdvancED Network.*

CAMPUS / FACILITIES:

Covers 51 acres and seven main buildings in a desert setting. Includes 530-seat auditorium and 250-seat theater; three-court gymnasium, weight room, wrestling room, and athletic fields; science labs, art studios, library/media center; cafeteria; open plaza, maintenance facility. Career and Technical Education labs include graphic design computer labs and workroom, engineering lab, production broadcast studio, digital photography studio and darkroom, sports medicine lab and training room, two biotechnology labs and theatrical scene shop.

INSTRUCTIONAL PROGRAMS:

Nine departments offer 150 courses covering a Comprehensive Core Curriculum with Honors & AP course offerings, 21st Century learning initiatives, comprehensive Career and Technical Education, and comprehensive Special Education. Electives include Band, Choir, Ceramics, Engineering, Graphic Design, Guitar, Mandarin Chinese, Film and TV, Business Management, Sports Medicine, Orchestra, Photo Imaging, Speech and Debate, Steel Drums, Theatre.

SCHEDULE:

Two 18-week semesters. Class schedule contains seven 60-minute periods with a split lunch. Each class meets four times a week on a rotating schedule. Students take a minimum of six classes.
